Lyari corridor being the point of origination of the city has a historical, ecological, socio-economic and cultural value in the city. However, since over time it has lost its elite and political patronage its natural creek has become a sewerage disposal channel and most of the areas along it have degraded for want of better development. Any development, which takes place in it or along it, is either through market pressure or due to the presence of the various political and informal sectors working in and along it. The recent most infrastructure development along it is the construction of the Lyari Expressway. This project has devastated thousands of households and is leading to major land reclamation and land use change without any regard to the needs and natural evolution of the area.
- The study included; documentation, analysis and understanding of a historic, economic, sociocultural, ecological and transportation corridor. Identification of the social and spatial changes of a new growth corridor in Karachi that is being created because of the construction of the Lyari Expressway and its alternatives and impacts. The impacts of the Lyari Expressway on the real estate market, transportation, ecology, demographics and land use patterns on its micro and macro environments.
